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## **Managing Personnel**

For creating job roles for everyone, we began by discussing the required job roles and how many of the required personnel when would need for each role. For the Production Roles, we then voted by raising our hands for roles and someone noted down the votes.

Assignment Pre-Production for people was much more negotiation based. In the end we agreed for one person to do a script for one topic to share out the roles evenly. Anyone who did not have a job was expected to mention this to Ethan Cobb (the Director) who would then assign them a job. Another available option was for said person to find something to do independently.

To ensure that everyone was happy with their role/s for 'Problems Podcast', messages were sent on a team group chat called "Problems Podcast" so that people could reply if they wanted to switch roles. This group chat was a primary source of communication for Level 3 Media Practice Year 2 Group A during the 'Problems Podcast' studio production, enabling us to address any problems and share ideas promptly and effectively. We also uploaded our coursework here to be used in the Production Team's TV Project Portfolios and so that the coursework could be used for creating new pre-production or developing old pre-production.

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# Secondary Research / Script Materials

#### Researching disabilities.

This can play a huge part in a young person's identity and can contribute/impact their life in many ways. They are most likely to be exposed to family, peer and community violence, poor parenting and family instability- this increased risk is most likely to result from the combined effects of the link between child learning disability and poverty and systemic and overt discrimination faced by people with learning disabilities in England & are less likely to have access to the resources necessary to build resilience in the face of adversity. Many disabled youths feel there isn't enough support, or they are unable to access the support that is needed or enough support to be able to cope in their day to day lives however there is much more awareness for the different types of disabilities, and many more websites to help.

Nearly 1 million people are believed to have a learning disability in England alone & 6% of children and 16% of working age have a disability across the UK.

However, there is probably many more cases within the UK that have been undiagnosed or untreated.

Each day, 180 disability hate crimes are reported in the UK. Children with disabilities are less likely to start school, have lower rates of school attendance and lower transition rates to higher levels of education.

## Disabilities Research – Josie Hanson

In my portfolio, I have decided to include the Secondary Research on disabilities by Josie Hanson, and Script Prompts / Key Conversations created by Josie Hanson and Pauline Baroudi.

I have included this because as lot of the research and script ideas by Josie Hanson were eventually used in the scriptwriting for 'Problems Podcast'.

I also included notes written by Keira Briggs because I genuinely find them very interesting and feel that it is a bit of a shame that these notes were not mentioned within the Production Meetings of 'Problems Podcast'. I feel that some of Josie and Keira's notes could have added a personal and intimate mode of address as they show the effects of disabilities on people through individual cases.

Ultimately, some of the notes have been scrapped due to time constraints during production and regardless of content; 'Problems Podcast still ended up being a very professional and well-run studio production.

### Key conversation/talking points for disabilities segment.

- Rise in energy bills, a mother worried that they are unable to pay for her son's lifesaving machines due to energy bills getting more and more expensive. The son suffers with cerebral palsy, epilepsy, dystonia, <u>scoliosis</u> and respiratory issues and survives off of these machines so due to the cost she is worried.
- Another father of a 5-year-old boy that has dystonia which is a condition that causes his muscles to contract involuntarily. The dad panicked about the rise in energy bills due to not being able to afford the heating, because if the son gets too hot or too cold it can cause him severe <u>pain</u> so he is needing to keep the heating on at a temperature to keep him safe but due to the prices it seems impossible.
- Could talk about hidden disabilities. Especially when it comes to disability parking spaces or disabled toilets people with hidden disabilities often get judged or get weird looks, because they look 'normal'.
- Talk about Rose Ayling-Ellis, a deaf girl who was on strictly come dancing and the silent dance she performed with a partner, which showed a lot of people what it's like to live in a deaf world.
- Lack of accessibility on trains for people in wheelchairs, many experiences that wheelchair users have had is that strangers/passengers have had to carry the wheelchair user.

# Key Conversation Points for Disabilities – Josie Hanson

#### Guests prompts

#### Social media:

Link bullying to social media and how people can get bullied on social media.

 It is reported that more than 1 in 3 young people experience bullying online, however not every young person that has been bullied online has told a parent or trusted adult about it- can talk about their opinion to this.

Can then link this to social media influencers that experience hate comments.

• There are also many people, especially young people that are influencers. For example, people posting on social medias such as Instagram. This could be posting themselves using products or wearing products for promotion however them getting a lot of hate, this could be about the way they look or the way they've acted, just very small things an influencer can do that viewers pick up on and hate on them for it- can talk about their opinion on this.

Can talk about the negative ways hate/bullying on social media affects people.

• Many people feel forced off the internet or take breaks due the hate as it can really affect people negatively. It can take a toll on people's mental health- can talk about cancel culture as well & their opinion on this.

Charlie answers Jack answers Unlike the other scripts written for 'Problems Podcast', you can see that Joe reviewed the Secondary Research on disabilities (carried out by Josie Hanson) and transcribed the facts/statistics onto his scrip as an order of prompts. This was edited later in autocue when Katie Grove (in charge of autocue) placed "Charlie" under the dialogue and turned the facts/stats into sentences and dialogue.

#### Things to Improve

Personally, I would have liked Joe to have added timings, character cues (who says each line) and parentheticals as it will have made the script more helpful to go on.

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# My Own Scriptwriting for 'Problems Podcast'

## Secondary Research behind my Scripts

All my script work was primarily based on my own research (alongside communication between Katie Grove and Pauline Baroudi and their findings as they had researched the same films as me). For my Primary Search, I investigated the following headings for the following reasons:

- Movie Information (genres, release date, cast etc.) This felt like an obvious set of findings to investigate because in entertainment shows, it is industry-standard to discuss what the film may be about, cast and release dates. This was also sone so that through my script, I could make the films sound exciting and use famous cat names as a way of promoting and endorsing the films.
- The Film's Trailers I also analysed the genres, purpose, content, and meanings of film trailers as to speculate my own ideologies of what Black Panther: Wakanda Forever and Avatar: The Way of The Water" might be about. I felt that this would make a good conversation-starter between presenters. This also included predicting a target audience based on said trailers to verify that the films would appeal to a young target audience and connect with what we were discussing on 'Problems Podcast'.
- **Behind-The-Scenes** I looked at how the films were made and behind-the-scenes as viewers often love seeing video leaks and behind the scenes are often included within film DVD's. This helped me to find out interesting facts and statistics especially regarding Avatar's ground-breaking Motion-Capture. Avatar is a great example of behind-the-scenes discussion as it m0ton capture has been adopted into video games and other films. This relates to young viewers due to connoting themes of technology which helped to make 'Problems Podcast' current, relevant, contemporary, and innovative for young viewers.
- **Movie Inspirations** I felt that looking at the inspirations behind movies would help to interest viewers and inform them of interesting stories which will not have been covered by other studio productions, helping to make 'Problems Podcast' innovative, informative, unique, creative, imaginative, and outside-the-box.

Crew Role	What does this person do?
Director	The Director is responsible for the 'Production' and management of their media production and thus has to work with all crew members to ensure that they know what their job is, that they know how to carry out their roles and that the crew do their job/s correctly at all times.
Assistant Director	The duties of Assistant Director include tracking daily progress against the filming production schedule, sorting logistics, preparing daily call sheets checking cast and crew; and ensuring the is order on set.
PA	The PA has the crucial job of ensuring that all timings are kept accurate and exact. This includes setting Countdowns and notifying the Studio Floor of such countdowns to the Floor Manager so that the Floor Manager can (through hand signals) help to wrap up smoothly and enable the show to transition onto its next segment.
Floor Manager	The Floor Manager's position is unique because they are the only personnel that can communicate from the TV Studio Floor to the Studio Gallery. This is done through headphones which feedback audio from the gallery to the Floor Manager. A microphone is also attached, enabling the Floor Manager to communicate from the Floor to the Gallery.
	The Floor Manager is responsible for ensuring that everyone is doing their job correctly in the studio. Thus, they must work with everyone on the studio floor by telling them if there are any issues or messages that may have been noticed by the Gallery.
	The Floor Manager also works with the Director due to the Director overseeing the show and ensuring that the production is to the best quality possible.

	This may also include communications between the Floor Manager and Assistant Director is the main Director is unavailable at the time (such as if when the Director tells the Vision Mixer when to cut to the next camera).
Vision Mixing	The vision mixing has access to a view of all the current shots being framed per camera, and the personnel's job is to switch between cameras. The camera cuts must be based on who is seeking, where the action is and if a certain camera is having trouble with its framing or colour correction etc. Another vital part of vision mixing is that by having the ability to use a range of shots given by each camera, the vision mixer can use his/her/they/their multi-camera production to capture every moment.
	To operate the vision mixer, the operator presses the button with saying the required camera ("Cam 1" etc) in the "Preview" row. He then presses "Cut" to switch to that camera on the "Prgm" channel, which is seen by the show's viewers. The vision mixer would also do the same for a VT but would press th relevant button under "VT 1" or "VT 2" and so on.
	It is the Vision Mixers responsibility to work with the director. For instance, whenever the Director says "Cue", the Vision Mixer must get that camera or VT ready to cut to. When the Director says "Cut Cam No/Cut VT", the Vision Mixer must have the Camera/VT queued so he can immediately select "Cut".
	The Vision Mixer also as to work with Graphics as they are responsible for loading VT's and Graphics onto the Vision Mixer via a USB Stick.
Gaffer (Lighting)	The Gaffer's job is to set the lighting, so it is even across the set and cast. This is the gaffer's only chance to set the lighting because the TV Studio LIVE Production is a continuous project once it begins airing and will not stop to let the lighting be adjusted.

	More lighting staff are located upstairs in the Studio Gallery. They use a set of buttons which can be pushed up/down to make the bright lighter or darker. Pushing said buttons all the way up makes them brighter whilst the opposite turns the Lighting off completely.
	The same team also has access to a range of different colours and lighting temperatures.
Camera Operators	The camera operators professionally and collaboratively frame and set their angles to capture as much of the action as possible and to offer a variety of shorts for the Director and Vision Mixer. They are also in charge of helping to move Cameras if necessary and work with the Director and Floor Manager to decide where the Cameras should be placed during a TV Studio Production.
Audio Technicians	The Audio Technicians help to mic-up the cast, control audio levels from the gallery and can mute or unmute the cast when necessary.
	The Audio Technicians consequently must work with cast in putting ion the Pello Mics. Alongside this, the Floor Manager helps to oversee this and everyone else on the Studio Floor whilst the Director and Assistant Director can check that all cast are miked- up through the screens in front of the Vision Mixer.
Graphics	The Graphics Team oversee the supply of VT's, Stings, and Credits for the TV Studio Productions. This mean that they must follow the Director's briefs on what each graphic should look like, create the graphics, and upload them to the Vision Mixer.
Cast	Cast are anyone who appear in front of the camera. In a TV Studio Production, their duties include introducing and wrapping up the show and each of its segments, reading from the autocue and performing the show content. This involves the cast reading from the autocue (shown on the front of the camera) to professionally perform the required dialogue. Simultaneously, they must not look at the camera constantly and must speak with the other presenters in a talk-show.

Cast may be allowed to look at the camera if the Studio Production is of a news show.
Cast and Autocue work together during rehearsals to communicate the speed at 2hich the script runs. If it is too slow/fast, the Cast can talk through their Pello Microphones – which can be heard by the Studio Gallery and adjusted accordingly.
If the lights are too bright or warm, the Cast can talk into the same mics and the Lighting Team can use this information to lower the lights temporarily.

# **Blue Peter**

#### Clothing

The clothing in Blue Peter is more casual than Newsround as stereotyped by the T-Shirts etc. This is to represent Blue Peter being a light-hearted entertainment show. This is also to relate to a young target audience who are far mor likely to wear colloquial clothing such as those of the Blue Peter presenters.

#### Set Design

 In the middle of the sofa and to the left of it interviews is a large cut out of the 'Blue Peter' logo. This is placed in the centre of frame so that it is seen first by the viewer to make the show iconic, memorable, and recognizable. This also creates an original and iconic branding style and helps to explain the denotation of whites and blues throughout the set.



- To match with 'Blue Peters' maritime logo and sting, patterns often include colours circles, and we like cut-out on set. This and the use of blue and white helps to connote a branding identity to make 'Blue Peter' iconic, memorable, and recognizable for its target audience. Blue also acts as visual language as it can be used for calming the viewer and could be representing the sea (due to the show's marine logo) and the white could be reflecting purity and the foam created by crashing waves against the shore.
- Technology is a major part of the Blue Peter set design due to it including LED Lighting. This relates to a young target audience because youth are often stereotyped withy technology. This enables Blue Peter to be current, relevant, innovative, contemporary, and relatable for its young target audience. It may also relate to young Reformers as LED's are better for the environment and young people have

become much more aware of environmental issues in recent years. This relates to the ideology that Reformers want self-improvement and self-esteem as using LED for greener lighting is an example of selfimproving your set design.



## **Researching Newsround**

## Why did I research 'Newsround'?

I wanted to research Newsround to see how CBBC makes news appealing for young viewers – who may easily be bored by grown-up news shows (such as BCC News). Another reason for researching Newsround was due to 'Problems Podcast' purpose of informing its audience, just like Newsround's purpose to inform and educate viewers on majpr news around he world.

# How did my research of 'Newsround' contribute to 'Problems Podcast'?

Similarly, to Newsround, the set for 'Problems Podcast' had a sofa, a small table and a chair so that viewers could focus on the content. This enables 'Problems Podcast to successfully inform its target audience.

# **Researching 'Blue Peter'**

### Why did I research 'Blue Peter'?

I decided to research 'Blue Peter' because it is a very iconic and famous UK children's studio production which entertains its audience and in forms them on deeper issues such as racism. In terms of Set Design, I wanted to see how the icon and fame of Blue Peter was carried throughout its set.

# How did my research of 'Blue Peter' contribute to 'Problems Podcast'?

Similarly, to Blue Peter, Katie Grove used blue and white for the 'Problems Podcast logo and put it on a circular background. Based On this decision, me and Maton used a gaming loop background which contained bright blue, dark blue and some yellow to help reinforce a branding style for Problems Podcast. This enables Problems Podcast to be iconic. Memorable and recognisable for its target audience.

#### Set Design (continued)

- Leading on from negative news coverage, the use of blue and purple could be to
  provide hope to the viewer. Furthermore, the brightness of the blue creates a lighthearted tone perhaps a counterbalance to negative news coverage.
- The denotation of purple is very feminine and indicates that Newsround is primarily choosing females as its target audience.
- The overall set layout is very small and simple as it revolves around a sofa and small
  desk and just <u>two\_monitors</u> to show graphics and VT's (to the presenter). This is to
  make the news show accessible to a young target audience who may find comfort in

# This Morning

### Set Design

- The spaciousness and quality of the kitchen connotes affluence, aspiration, excellence, <u>luxury</u> and high quality – appealing to the Higher Middle Class (including doctors, lawyers and bankers).
- The kitchen is very bright which appeal to young viewers de to connoting positivity and happiness. Furthermore, it <u>connote</u> a high0market kitchen which reinforces the appeal to the Higher Middle Class (which consists of doctors, lawyers and bankers; alongside any managerial and high-paid positions).





- The set for This Morning is very colourful, bright spacious and cosy due to its being laid out as though it is a living room. This enables This Morning to appeal to young viewers and their parents – enabling it to be watched by parents in the mornings. The cosiness, warmness and friendliness idealized by the living room set of This Morning also make it feel relatable to the colloquial look of younger stereotypes.
- The idea of This Morning being a family show is further reinforced through the kitchen set – connecting with the ideology of families watching this from the kitchen as they east their breakfasts.
- The set colours of slate-greys and beige connote that This Morning is more grown-up whilst being able to appeal to children and families as well. The colours and style of set also connotes luxury, highquality, aspiration and excellence
- As in Blue Peter, the spaciousness of the This Morning connects with the ideologies of children wanting to have space to run or play in.



The picture below shows how many people watch This Morning daily, showing that it is a popular morning show that could be viewed by young people on weekends.

How many people watch This Morning daily? ^ The show typically receives **1 million** viewers daily. On 3 October 2018, the show had one of its highest ratings, when 2.7 million viewers tuned in for its 30th anniversary.

This Morning's set contributed to Problems Podcast due to the cosy, warm, welcoming and friendly atmosphere connoted by the living room set and due to the kitchen making the show relatable. Based on this, the set of Problems Podcast also had a sofa, living room and as small living-room table (with a plant pot on) to create as cosy, inviting, warm and inviting a feel as possible for its target audience.

# **Connecting Each Segment**

As a Production Team, my group agreed to do social and cultural issues to as having social/culitural issues for young people was the first production requirement of our brief. This also enabled us to move between each sections smoothly.

Our first topic of discussion was disabilities which links to bullying became having a disability is often hy many people are unfortunately bullied. This enabled us to swiftly, smoothly, free-flowingly and professionally transition into the bullying segment which enabled us to expand on bullying through a Cyberbullying VT. This then enabled u to link to social media because social media is where cyberbullying occurs.

The last social/cultural issue being discussed was cars due to the high prices of running costs and insurance etc.

Discussing cars last enabled us to segway onto Lewis Hamilton and then Black History Month due to Lewis Hamilton being black. This enabled us to meet two other of our Production Requirements – to discuss a little on Black History Month and an inspirational person who is/was black.

Moving on from Black History Month and a black, inspirational person; we discussed a film with black cast, crew and black director "Black Panther: Wakanda Forever". This included an Overlay to talk over so that viewers could visualise the film and have a brief idea of what it might be about.

We then moved onto Avatar: The Way of The Water. Originally, I had scripted it to go from one of the Black Panther cast's 3D printed hat, and into the Motion-Graphics of Avatar to link both films together through technology.

<b>Talk show (Magazine Format)</b> For all the VT's and graphics in 'Problems Podcast' this show is fundament tally a talk-show in a Magazine Style format appealing to a young target audience. This was achieved by using a range of social/cultural issues with young society to adhere to the format's convention of an array of subjects and scripting the dialogue as a conversation to make it feel relatable; familiar and every-day (thus appealing to its target audience). The conversational dialogue allowed the show to be more spontaneous (reinforced through the VT's and Overlay's) – another convention of Magazine Forms Talk Shows.

### **Bed Music**

Bed Music was used in the background of the presenter dialogue during 'Problems Podcast' so that the audience could listen alOong to the show without becoming bored or overwhelmed with dialogue. This adds rhythm, enabling the show to move along easily to making it feel more interesting. The music was also fairly quiet and calming for its viewer so that it did not distract from the dialogue.

Th music chosen had a drum beat and electric keyboards. This appeals to a young target audience because it makes it sound modern, contemporary, and relevant. This helps to match with contemporary and modern mode of address connected by the discussions is youth issues in culture and society.

### VT Music

For the VT's, we had music to create interest for our target audience. For instance, in our Lewis Hamilton VT, the fast and intense music helped to match the dangerous, intense, scary, upbeat, lively, and energetic mode of address connoted through the cinematography of car racing. This helped to make the show upbeat and surprising and will have motivated our target audience into watching more of 'Problems Podcast'.

In the Sprite advert however, the music enabled the VT for Sprite to be energetic, upbeat, and atmospheric.

### Voiceovers

The two VT's which had voiceovers were the Lewis Hamilton VT and Cyberbullying VT.

In the Cyberbullying VT, the voiceover is made to sound, brief, bold, lively, and shouty. This made me go for the "Speak, Stop, Support" cyberbullying VT as it made it sound lively and energetic. This fits perfectly young viewers perfectly as they will be more likely to have more energy than older generations. Also, this bold tone and direct address from the voiceover immediately engages any viewer by making the voiceover feel more intimate and personnel. It also enables the Cyberbullying VT to be more entertaining and comedic due to the accompanying use of animations and sound effects.

Another use of voiceover was in the Lewis Hamilton where we hear the commentator audio alongside the cinematography of Lewis Hamilton at the Grand Prix or Formula 1. This helped to make 'Problems Podcast' appeal to young views by making said studio production entertainment, upbeat, lively and energetic.

### Sting

A sting / Logo was developed by Katie Grove for the show because she has often used Adobe Illustrator and has a paid job in Graphic Design outside of her educational studies. The sting was created to make 'Problems Podcast' unique, iconic, and more memorable and to create a housing style of graphics which would be instantly recognizable to young viewers.

### Credits

For 'Problems Podcast', we are using pre-made outros (made by myself and Marton Andras). We have used the "Gaming Background Loop" because we want to match the bright-blue and sleekness created by Katie Grove's 'Problems Podcast' logo. Yellow was also featured in the "Gaming Background Loop" to add contrast, positivity and because it went well with the bright and dark blues.

Both the intro credits feature Motion-Graphics – noticeably Marton's use of film reel-like animation to connote a traditionalistic media production and my use of Motion Graphics to move previews of each presenter to add interest and fun to 'Problems Podcast', thus appealing to a young, lively target audience.

### **Overlays**

For discussing film trailers, I and the Production Team initially decided to use film trailers for discussing "Black Panther" and "Avatar: The Way of The Water". However – after feedback from a media lecturer – we collaboratively switched to an overlay of

the "Black Panther" and "Avatar" franchise (which was sourced by Katie Grove online, then edited by her for turning the sourced materials into an overlay). This managed to have the same effect as the film trailers because it enabled the discussion to remain logically placed in the show, current and relevant to 'Problems Cast'. On the other hand, it improved the show because it created more interested and made the films more relatable. This is because we were able to make the dialogue and film overlays match each other through the PA's timings as the presenter/s spoke about said films.

## Topic-Related VT's (with audio)

For each section, we had VT's / short clips related to whatever we were discussing. For instance, we used a Lewis Hamilton VT between the "cars" section and discussion of Lewis Hamilton. This helped to make the content feel more relatable, professional, logical ordered and well-presented so that the show could flow smoothly. This also enabled us to transition between sections to reinforce the argument just made.

The sleekness of the show caused by how VT's and content was structured connotes high quality, excellence, and aspiration.

Using topic-related VT's also helped viewers to understand where they were for relatability and helped to add variety to the show and prevent boredom due to overuse of discussion. This helped to make 'Problems Podcast' more interesting and entertaining and enticed the audience into the next topic when using segways to transition to other sections of discussion.

### Sprite Advertisement

A Sprite advertisement made by Laylah Vickers in her first year of Level 3 Media Practice was used. This was used so that all VT's could be pre-made y the Production Team, - making our broadcast more authentic and original. More importantly, adding Laylah's sprite advertisement was done to prevent copyright through using other student's work without their permission.

### **Secondary Research**

For the TV Project production of 'Problems Podcast', I carried out Secondary Research of 'Black Panther' and 'Avatar'. This was done through looking at the film trailer as we would be showing it as an overlay on 'Problems Podcast' and discussing how what the content affected the anticipation of what the films may be like. This approach was used so that I could create a script which spoke about the film so that it could relate to the viewers more.

I also researched behind-the-scenes facts by looking on YouTube and a range of different articles. This is so that I could create a script where viewers would learn interesting facts about the films which may not be mentioned on other shows – this will have provided a Unique Selling Point for 'Problems Podcast'.

What I also researched included the release date and cast so that viewers could connote an ideology of when next to see the film and who to expect to see in it. This creates meaning because it gives an ideology of what to expect from Avatar and Black Panther in that each actor brings their own personality into the film. This helped me with scriptwriting because I was able to make my film trailer script as free-flowing, spontaneous, and unscripted as possible. This helped the host to ask questions (making the audience think/speculate about Black Panther and Avatar) and enabled a conversational tone which appeal to a young target audience due to it being relatable and colloquial.

### Scriptwriting

After carrying out my Secondary Research of 'Black Panther' and 'Avatar', I began a script for film trailers based on facts/statistics found by myself, Pauline Baroudi and Katie Grove.

For my scriptwriting, I wanted it to be as spontaneous, conversational, authentic, free-flowing and colloquial as in order to appeal and relate to a young target audience through a Magazine Show format. To do this, I scripted all the facts and statistics to the host, who then used said information to ask the discussion panel with. To show this, I gave the host the bulk of dialogue and initially wrote "<unscripted>" to connote that the discussion panel could say what they wished.

In "Rough Draft 2" of my script, I spread the dialogue out more evenly based on looking at other people's scripts for 'problems Podcast' and also based on feedback from said scriptwriters and Katie Grove (who used my "Film Trailers" script for storyboarding). However, this was returned to its original format in "Rough Draft 3" to maintain the show's conversational tone. Regardless, prompts such as "I think that..." were added to help the cast (who had often been struggling to think of how to start their sentences during the early development of 'Problems Podcast').

For "Rough Draft 5" of my "Film Trailer" script, I corrected the Character Cues as I had been switched to Vision Mixing and Marton had replaced me as Host. This was a team-agreed decision to motivate Jack Brown into becoming more involved with 'problems Podcast' as he had not produced any VT's despite being told to. The host changed again in "Rough Draft 7" to Charlie Farmer due to Marton stopping his dialogue abruptly during the rehearsals.

Another major change is that from "Rough Draft 5" onwards of my "Film Trailer" script, I added a table for timings, VT's, and subjects etc as inspired by a sample script for Good Morning Britain shown to us by Emily Tait. I also made the dialogue between the host and a "FILM SPECIALIST" as Emily Tait suggested more variety of cast when we re-watched our initial rehearsal of 'Problems Podcast'.

By Rough Draft 8 of my script, it was "Charlie" (just asking about Black Panther and Avatar and the "FILM SPECIALIST" describing the said films. Ethan Cobb (the director) and the remainder of Production Team agreed that it would make more sense and seemed like a logical decision.

### Outro

Foer 'Problems Podcast', I produced and post-produced an Outro for the 'Problems Podcast'. This included working with Marton as he was doing the Intro. Consequently, I used the same background style by going into Adobe Premiere Pro's "Essential Graphics" and then going to "Browse", selecting "Gaming Background LOOP". I chose this background as the blue's matched with Katie Grove's sting for 'Problems Podcast and because the yellow helps to add positivity to the show. This could be connoted further as hope when considered that the show discusses the issues of today in youth society and culture.

## Cyberbullying VT

I was also tasked with souring a cyberbullying VT as media lecturer Emily Tait felt that there should be another VT in our show. In a Production Meeting, we discussed a short film on upcoming films 'Black Panther: Wakanda Forever' and 'Avatar: The Way of The Water'. However, the team felt that adding a short VT would be better. With Ethan Cobb (Director, Jack (Cast), Louise (Assistant Director) and Matthew Gale (PA) agreeing to put a VT between bullying and social media, I suggested a VT on Cyberbullying – which was met with approval from the crew and little opposition from the Production Team.

A major issue though is that the Director and Assistant Director worded it as though it would be Matthew Gale that would edit the Cyberbullying VT. This is because the 1-minute VT was too long and needed to be 20 seconds to prevent overrunning the show. Consequently, I had to quickly edit the VT on the day of rehearsals on 27/09/2022. Due to being rushed, I felt unhappy with this VT and decided to look back at it by cutting it to 20 seconds afterwards.

I also struggled Encoding a playable version of said VT to a MOV 1280 by 720 file due to the Media Player in the PC's of N3. Hence, I decided to undergo VT Encoding in the studio's Editing Suite instead.

Originally, my role during the production of 'Problems Podcast' was to ne a host. However, this changed to Vision Mixing when my Production Team realised that VT's were not being produced. At first, I felt a little uncomfortable towards this rile. This is because I want to be a Presenter when I am older and had not used Vision Mixers regularly enough to be good at Vision Mixing.

Mistakes which must be avoided by the Vision Mixer include cutting to cameras or VTs at an incorrect time. This is the Director's job (who says "Cue Cam/VT" to make the Vision Mixer prepare said camera/VT and "Cut Cam/VT" to make the Vision Mixer switch to that Camera/VT).

The vision-Mixer must also NOTY select the camera / VT on both the "Prgm" and "Preview" tabs simultaneously as this will change the VT's and clip numbers. This would create confusion and means that the incorrect clip may be played during VTs. This has a detrimental effect due to confusing all crew/cast, preventing studio production from making sense, running smoothly and loses the target audience from the show. It also means that the timings are also misplaced which could risk losing out on important parts of the show.

I communicated this to my group by notifying the director, my then-tutor Josh Sparkes, and Jack Brown (the presenter who was Vision Mixer before I replaced his role) gave me tips on how to Vision-Mix them. However, further guidance under media technician Barry Mitchell helped me to use vision mixing more professionally.

Another example of when I communicated with the Production Team is when I asked the Director about VTs before rehearsals and recording. This is so that I could write down the running order of graphics, VTs, and overlays. Another example is during rehearsals, where I would respond to the Director saying "Cue"/ "Cut" [cam or VT]. Amid hearing these words, the vision mixer must select the camera /VT number on the "Preview" section. When the Director says "Cut", the Vision Mixer must cut to that camera/VT by selecting "Cut" by the right of the "Preview" selection.

'Problems Podcast' mostly met the brief. This is because it discussed three youth social/cultural issues (which were costs of cars for young people, disabilities, and social media with segways touching on other issues in between). Secondly, it met the criteria because it delved into upcoming films and Black History Month (including an inspirational black person from history).

Another success of 'Problems Podcast' is the final choice of VTs and cinematography's. This is because the Director told me to cut to camera where the person speaking was in the centre of frame. This enabled the viewer to relate to what was being said and by whom it was being said. It also helped to overlays to match with the dialogue to create i8nterest and attract t the viewers towards Black Panther and Avatar by giving them an idea towards what the film might be about. And the interesting stories behind said films.

Fourthly, all the production team communicated well with each other so that everyone knew exactly what they were doing, and this enabled us to knuckle down in a range of ideas.

Lastly, I (as Vision Mixer) would cue shots randomly when not instructed by the Director. When doing this, I focused on which camera had the most interesting action, who was speaking and had to anticipate who would speak next and what would happen next. This enabled me to be well-prepared for most scenarios and allowed me to switch cameras more quickly to make 'Problems Podcast' smoother, professional, and effective.

The only issue which I have is that I wonder if cars is more of a grown-up issue than a youth one. This is because cars are very expensive for young people and not many people between 26 to 19 have car or need one either. Another reason is because as a Leaner Driver, I recently discovered from my Approved Driving Instructor Billie Smith (from 'Billie Smith Driving Solutions') that some people wait till after university before getting a car so that they can build up their savings and because they might not use it much during university anyway.
